Every season, we hope that our esteemed Roys teams will go all the way to finals and beyond. Season 2023 finished with four of our six teams in finals and, on the back of making it to the Premier B grand final, the Senior Men have been promoted to the Premier division of the Victorian Amateur Football Association for the first time in the modern history of the club.

At the same time, the Women's teams under the guidance of new coaches Nathan Jumeau and Jason Valastro, adapted to again being in the VAFA Premier division. It's fair to say that their competitive efforts were often not reflected on the scoreboard.

Sadly, it was our last season having access to the talent, dedication and vision of Luke Mahoney as Senior Men's Coach. There was barely a dry eye at the Redlow when he and Reserves Coach Bernie Carter paid tribute to each other.

Happily, Bernie will again shepherd players through the Men's squads and as coach of the Men's Reserves. His wisdom and knowledge of the club will be invaluable to incoming coach Travis Ronaldson, who we are delighted to welcome as Senior Coach for Season 2024.

We also farewelled club stalwart and Life Member Trent Coleman who has coached the Thirds Division 1 for over seven seasons and moreover, took them to the finals in every one of those seasons. Trent is one of the Fitzroy faithful who wears his love for the slub and his players on his sleeve, and we look forward to seeing him around the club and at games for many more years to come.



For the second year in a row, Silvano Inserra and Kane King guided a massive squad of players in and out of the Thirds Premier division and into the Reserves and Senior team, and leading them to a place in the preliminary final. We are very lucky they are determined to fight on until they get to the grand final.

Fitzroy was again successful in having several players named in the VAFA Men's Premier B and Women's Premier VAFA Teams of the Year: Ted Clayton (also named captain), Charlie Faubel, Nathan Ligris, Rhys Seakins and Donovan Toohey for the Men, and Sarah Lynas and Simone Mooney for the Women.

As we move towards the tenth season of our Women's teams next year, we celebrated a number of our foundation players reaching 100 games this season. Liz Olney became the first woman to reach this milestone for the Fitzroy Football Club, followed a few weeks later and Alexa Madden and Luci Murphy. While we'll be watching to see Liz kicking even more goals next season, and Lex returning to the field after taking maternity leave, Luci, captain Cass Blake, and goal-kicking star Erin Gogerly have hung up their boots. We'll miss them all on field but are sure to see them at games and events.

Of course, all of this was only made possible by an outstanding collaborative effort of our players, coaches, and volunteers, working together to achieve this incredible on-field success.

Equally importantly, the off field, inclusive, welcoming culture that is so much a feature of our great club, makes us the best club in the VAFA.

I'd like to say thank you to everyone who has been involved with the club this year – coaches, players and their families, members, life members, supporters and everyone involved in our wonderful Fitzroy community. You have all played your part, and we couldn't have done it without you.

Season 2023 overview

In 2023, Fitzroy fielded five teams: Senior Men's and Reserves, Senior Women's and Reserves, Thirds Premier and Thirds Division 1.

To great excitement, the Senior Men won through to the Premier B Grade Grand Final and progression to Premier Division in 2024. After a consistent and impressive season, the Men's Reserves were ultimately unable to make the Grand Final, while the two Thirds teams both made it through to Preliminary Finals.

Our Women's teams returned to Premier Division for Season 2023, with the scoreboard not reflecting the competitiveness of our teams at the highest level.

Our recruitment efforts again resulted in a strong representation of players who pulled on the jumper throughout the season. In total, a total of 167 men and 92 women played a game for the Roys, made up of:

Player Wellbeing

Aided by our fantastic player wellbeing team – Ross Borland, Jamie MacKay, Gemma Minuz, Luci Murphy, Jaime Nelson, Steph Pitt, and Jack Wotherspoon – the Club facilitated a wide range of wellbeing programs and guest speakers.

Strongly supported by our playing group and senior coaches, these activities were designed to raise awareness of the many different issues that can impact our players' wellbeing and provide practical support to those who may need help and resources to manage issues potentially affecting their wellbeing.

Season highlights

- Todd Morgan (CEO) and Tim Cook (Program Coordinator) from Outside the Locker Room conducted two sessions on gambling and resilience. These were well received by participating players. Outside the Locker Room, a wellbeing partner of the Brisbane Lions, provides mental health education and welfare support to sporting clubs, schools and workplaces across Australia.
- **4** Guest speaking presentations at our Thursday night player dinners by:
 - Dom Condo, Performance Science and Nutrition Manager, Richmond FC, on Performance Nutrition Fundamentals, which was hugely popular with the playing group.
 - A Q&A session with Jasper Pittard (ex-AFL player) about his footy career including his time at the Fitzroy Juniors, Port Adelaide, the Kangaroos and now I his new role as co-founder of Footy for Climate.
- Georgia Ransome and Tash Giusti from Good People Act Now (GPAN, part of Banksia Gardens Community Services) facilitated two key Respectful Relationship workshops for some 30 new and younger male and female players, covering such topics as gender equality/inequality, violence against women, consent and being an active bystander.
- The Liminal wellbeing app was again made available to the entire group, of which over 80 players were active users. This app, designed by Will Hams (ex-Essendon player), is specifically designed to help sporting teams manage the wellbeing of their young players and play a proactive role in early intervention and prevention of issues affecting their wellbeing. The resource content focuses on areas such as nutrition, support networks, sleep routines and managing anxieties.
- Development of a partnership with Clifton Hill Medical Group to provide priority access and, where required, recommended practitioners, to Fitzroy players seeking advice on their wellbeing. Where any players were experiencing financial difficulties, the club provided suitable support to enable players to have access to a consultation.
- Bernie Wright and Ross Borland established a monthly player support evening at a local venue (club partner, Near and Far Bar) for any male players who wanted to drop in and discuss any topics/issues, including any wellbeing matters.

Brunswick Street Oval redevelopment

In last year's annual report, we advised that the Brunswick Street Oval Precinct redevelopment was due to begin construction in the first half of 2023, with completion anticipated in 2025.

This was on the back of our lobbying for, and success in, attracting Victorian State Government funding of approximately \$13 million in two separate tranches since 2017, including \$6.37 million committed in the 2022/23 State Budget to cover cost overruns inherent in a change of design arising from heritage considerations with the proposed design.

The City of Yarra confirmed its commitment to the project by providing additional funding of almost \$1 million in its 2022/23 budget as its contribution towards the upgraded facilities to enable better participation of women and girls, fit-for-purpose meeting rooms for community use, more public toilets and improved access and safety.

Regrettably, City of Yarra Council officers have recently advised the Edinburgh Gardens Sporting Community (EGSC), of which the Fitzroy Football Club is a partner with the Edinburgh Cricket Club, Fitzroy Junior Football Club and the Fitzroy Tennis Club, that despite earlier advice, no report will be going to Council this year to approve commencement of the project. Council officer advice is that this is due to significant cost overruns and a lack of a suitable tenderer for construction of the build as most recently designed.

Accordingly, Council officers have requested that the EGSC continue to work with Council to discuss and agree to a further amendment of the design parameters. These discussions and planning are ongoing, with hopes that new concept designs will be finalised by early 2024.





FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Report of the 2023 Financial Year Activities: November 2022 to October 2023

The club is pleased to announce an operating deficit of \$3578 for the financial year ended 31 October 2023. While it might be unusual to welcome a deficit, we had budgeted for a deficit of \$5549. So, we gained about \$2000, even though we had added costs resulting from most teams being in finals.

A big thank you for the ongoing financial support of our partner, the Australian Catholic University (ACU), and all our sponsors, members, and donors.

Also, a huge vote of thanks to former Director, Budget and Finance, Michael Smale, who provided support in the transition of the Treasurer role to Lesley Dredge.

Grants

To help fund development activities, the club remains extremely active in identifying and pursuing grant opportunities. Total grant funding received for the financial year was \$25,080, which has included contributions to activities such as:

- \$5500 through the Clifroy Bendigo Bank Autumn 2023 Grant Program to help cover costs of the Liminal Wellbeing App and Mental First Aid Training offered to our players.
- \$5300 through the TAC Club Rewards Program that will go towards training gear for our players, including new footballs.
- \$5000 through the Victorian Government Sporting Club Grants Program for development of a new Customer Relationship Management (CRM) platform by Platinum Sponsors, FitzroyIT. This will digitise and automate some previously manual operations.
- \$1780 through the AFL Strategic Community Investment Fund for various small initiatives, including cashless transaction facilities.

Fundraising

We continue to look at different ways to fundraise to support the club and we would like to highlight several fundraising ventures that were successful in contributing to our income in 2023.

The two biggest moments for merchandise were the release of the FFC Young Henrys T-shirts, which are now on their third print run of 100 shirts and have proved to be a massive success.

Then there was the unbelievable day we had at Brunswick Street Oval on the Sunday after the AFL Grand Final when Brisbane Lions fans gathered to meet the Lions players. In two hours, we sold out of all the stock we had, taking more than \$13,000.

As part of our move into the VAFA Men's Premier division, and with the work we are doing with the Fitzroy Junior Football Club under the banner of *We Are Fitzroy*, we are looking at ways to vary and rejuvenate some of our stock items to increase sales again in 2024.
