Over the years, hundreds of women players have donned the FFC guernsey and the teams have enjoyed many great wins and finals success.

Since 2022, they have run out for home games to their own song - a modified version of the FFC sung throughout the Club's history.

Timeline: A season-by season look at our women's first 10 years

19 April 2015	Fitzroy ACU plays its first game, with Lauren Atkinson kicking the team's first score (a point).
14 June 2015	First win! Fitzroy ACU 6.9.45 to Hallam 3.2.20
17 April 2016	Fitzroy ACU Reserves play for the first time.
29 May 2016	Fitzroy ACU Reserves first win, beating Roxburgh Park 21.11.137 to 1.1.7
21 August 2016	Fitzroy ACU Seniors lose to Gippsland in first Grand Final – 4.9.33 to 5.12.42
21 September 2016	Ash Riddell wins VFLW Best first year player award.
17 June 2017	Claudia Bell, Gemma Minuz and Tash Ross-Harris named in first VAFA Victorian women's squad.
21 August 2017	Tash Ross-Harris wins the inaugural VAFA Premier Women's Best and Fairest Award.
26 April 2018	Five Fitzroy ACU women on VFLW lists: Alexa Madden (Essendon), Hilary Grubb, Sarah King, Paige Nash (Collingwood), Tori Tonin (Richmond).
19 August 2018	Fitzroy ACU Reserves lose first grand final, 2.4.16 to Marcelling 5.9.39
17 October 2019	Tash Ross-Harris and Teresa Zampaglione named in first VAFA Team of the Year.
19 April 2021	Fitzroy ACU play first Pride Game. Guernseys designed by Nikkita Alexander.
23 May 2021	Fitzroy ACU partnership extended for further three years.
14 November 2021	Cass Blake is runner-up in the VAFA Premier B Best and Fairest Award.
9 April 2022	Fitzroy ACU women's teams run out to their own version of the Fitzroy song.
14 August 2022	Fitzroy ACU Seniors fall beaten by Old Scotch in Grand Final, 2.2.14 to 4.3.27
28 October 2023	Cass Blake named captain of the VAFA Team of the Year, which includes Lucy Kerr, Erin Gogerly and Lex Madden.
22 May 2023	Former Fitzroy Junior, Simone Mooney, wins VAFA Rising Star nomination.
29 May 2023	Liz Olney becomes the first Fitzroy ACU women's player to reach 100 games.
19 August 2023	Four Fitzroy ACU titans retire: Cass Blake, Erin Gogerly, Lucy Kerr and Luci Murphy.
13 July 2024	Fitzroy ACU women celebrate their 10th anniversary!
