The Bash began in 2013 on the red sand of the Simpson Desert. not far from the outback town of Birdsville. We staged an impromptu concert on top of the famed Big Red dune with the Australian icon. John Williamson. With little more than a PA system and his guitar, John played to 600 revellers under starry outback skies.

This tiny concert in the desert struck a chord and the next year

it became the Birdsville Big Red Bash. Since then the Bash has grown each year, and in 2021





almost 10.000 Bashers came together to rock the Simpson.

As we've grown, we've held onto our original Bash spirit: bringing people together to celebrate great company, awesome Aussie music and desert culture in the beautiful outback.

CAMPING OVERVIEW

YOUR CAMPSITE

All campsites in Bashville are marked out, like in a caravan park. When you roll in, marshals will guide you into the next available campsite. You'll have around 100sqm per vehicle – enough for all but the biggest rigs. **VIDEO**

CAMPING WITH A GROUP

If you're planning to camp with friends in other vehicles, you need to *arrive* at Bashville *together*. **No saving spots!** Meet in Birdsville and drive in convoy. You will be given adjoining campsites, which you can merge into a super-site.


FIRE SAFE CAMPING INFO



DAY TRIPPING FROM BIRDSVILLE

BEFORE YOU LEAVE HOME



YOU'RE ON YOUR WAY!



- Take scheduled breaks every couple of hours enjoy the country towns, creeks and warm hospitality of the locals.
- **Don't overtake in dusty conditions**. Slow down and hang back out of the dust. Be patient or stop for an early break and a roadside cuppa.
- If a truck or road train is coming towards you raising dust, slow down, **pull over to the side** of the road and wait till they pass.
- Be aware of loose and sloped road surfaces, even on straight sections of road. Drive slower than normal and enjoy the outback scenery.
- **Don't swerve to avoid an animal** if driving at high speed. Brake to minimise the impact and keep your car straight for the collision.
- The roads leading into and out of Birdsville will be busy. Allow at least a day of **buffer time** for the journey out and the same back.
- **Bookmark websites** showing outback road conditions on your route and check in before you travel.

HELP US KEEP THINGS TIDY

Don't leave any rubbish in or near town bins.

• If you need to dispose of rubbish, take it to the Birdsville Tip, located on the road back to town after the event.

PUBLIC DUMP POINTS (BLACKWATER)

- On the road from Birdsville to Big Red, to the left just before the Tip turn-off.
- On the way to the racetrack, south side of Diamantina River on the left.

SHOWERS

• Public showers available opposite Birdsville Sports Centre. Cost and open times available closer to the event.

DRINKING WATER

• Fill up drinking water at the taps on the Common or at Bronco Banding Yards on Big Red Road (which will be signposted) ONLY. There is no other drinking water in town.

BIRDSVILLE TOWN MAP

Birdsville is only small, most attractions are within walking distance.

EXPLORE BIRDSVILLE TOWN MAP.

Birdsville and surrounding areas will be busy before and after the Bash. Expect traffic, crowds and a bit of waiting. To help things run smoothly check out these tips:

AROUND TOWN

- Keep fuel queues short unhitch your caravan and set up camp, then fill up.
- Pay for your fuel, then move your car before making other purchases.

STAYING OVERNIGHT

- There are powered and unpowered camping sites available at **BIRDSVILLE CARAVAN** PARK. Book early.
- Free camping is available on the Common: south of town between the first cattle grid and the Diamantina Bridge (no facilities).
- No roadside camping around town or on the road to Bashville – it's all private property. Trespassers may damage station roads, disrupt dams or disturb the cattle. Don't set up here – you'll be moved on.







MEDICAL SERVICES

We have a well-resourced medical facility at Bashville staffed by doctors, paramedics and nurses from Queensland Health, but it is not a pharmacy. The closest hospital to Bashville is 700km away in Mt Isa, and the closest pharmacy is 625km away in Quilpie.

VISITING BIRDSVILLE

Birdsville is a small outback town situated on the banks of the Diamantina River between the sands of the Simpson Desert and the gibbers of the Sturt Stony Desert. The area is steeped in history, from Aboriginal meeting places to European settlement in the late 1870s and beyond.

The Big Red Bash is the largest event ever to be held in the area, and we are incredibly grateful to the local community for welcoming us to this beautiful region.

ADRIA DOWNS

Adria Downs is an accredited organic property and operates to the Organic Food Chain (OFC) Standards. The Station aims to produce high quality cattle, managed within the environmentally sustainable limits of the region, with the aim of conserving natural resources for future generations.

The Big Red Bash is held on this private property with the kind permission of its owners, and we aim to return it in better condition than we find it.

LOCAL BUSINESSES

Iconic Birdsville businesses such as the Birdsville Hotel, Birdsville Bakery, Birdsville Roadhouse are likely to have extended business hours during the Bash. Keep up-to-date with any changes including special Bash offers by visiting their social media, or check the *FESTIVAL GUIDE* which is published closer to the event.



BIRDSVILLE TO BASHVILLE

Around 4000 vehicles will bump into Bashville in only three days! It will take some time, but with a little patience, and some handy hints to keep things running smoothly – it'll be easy as.

GETTING TO BASHVILLE

• Choose the right roll in time for your ticket type

ROLL IN 8am - 6pm DAILY

2 DAY EARLY ENTRY...... FROM SUN 3
1 DAY EARLY ENTRY..... FROM MON 4
GENERAL ENTRY..... FROM TUES 5

- Camping with a group? Travel in convoy and arrive together.
- Head west on Adelaide St for 35km.
- The final 5km stretch of road is unsealed but well graded and suitable for all vehicle types.
 Take care, especially if dusty.
- Headlights on.
- No overtaking.
- When you arrive in Bashville, follow directions from Bash road marshals.
- Expect delays of up to two hours at peak times.
- At the gate, tell marshals if you are rolling in with a group of two or more vehicles.
- GATES CLOSE 6PM SHARP.


GETTING TO YOUR CAMPSITE

- Stick to the Bashville speed limit. 10km/h minimises dust and keeps everyone safe.
- Our marshals will direct you to GENERAL, BIG RIG, DOG or DISABILITY camping areas.
- Campsites are filled from front to back.

DURING THE BASH

• Come prepared and plan to park up, kick back and relax for the whole Bash!

PLEASE NOTE: The Big Red Dune will be closed to vehicle traffic from 6am Sun 3rd – 7am Sat 9th July. All vehicle access to and from the desert (to the west) will be via Little Red during the closure.





NO DRIVING IN BASHVILLE CAMP!

NEED TO LEAVE THE CAMPGROUND DURING THE BASH?



There's a transfer bus to town.



Drive out of camp during limited hours <u>ONLY</u>. **Sunday 3** – **Wednesday 6 @ 4 – 6pm** but you *can't drive back in*.



You *must* leave your car in Day Parking and walk back to camp.



Bring your car back to camp on Thursday @ 12.30 – 1.30pm.

BASHVILLE AMENITIES

BASHFM

Bring along your FM radio and tune in to **BashFM** for Bash news, live updates, artist interviews, the music you love and much, much more!

INFO TENT

In Bashville Plaza Open 8.30am – 5.30pm Sunday 3 – Thursday 7 July

PHONE RECEPTION/WIFI

There is no mobile reception at Bashville. Before you leave Birdsville, let your friends and family know you will be out of contact for a few days.

STAYING IN TOUCH

Leave a note for your friends on the Bash Community Noticeboard in the Info Tent at the Plaza. It's a great way to stay in touch with mates across Bashville, especially when phone reception is hard to come by!

CREDIT CARD/CASH OUT

Bring plenty of cash. There are no ATMs in Bashville, and very limited credit card facilities. The merchandise tent has EFTPOS, and offers limited cash-out.

FOOD

A wide range of delicious hot and cold foods and non-alcoholic beverages are available from our fantastic food vendors in the Plaza.

ICE/FIREWOOD

A limited supply of ice and firewood will be for sale. **Pre-order** at **koolazice.com.au/ preorderbrb2022** by 20th June.

SHOWERS

There are NO showers at Bashville. We recommend wet wipes or similar to keep clean.

WATER

There is no running water on site. Please bring your own.

GETTING HELP AT THE BASH MEDICAL CENTRE

If you feel unwell, visit the Bash Medical Centre in the Plaza.

IF YOU NEED EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE MEDICAL - FIRE - POLICE - SECURITY

- Use CB CHANNEL 5 on your car or handheld CB radio.
- Come to Event Control 24 hours a day.

A SUSTAINABLE & SAFE BASHVILLE

We always try to leave the Outback a little better than we found it. Here's how you can help us take care of the beautiful Simpson Desert and keep Bashville a family and dog friendly place.

COMPOSTING TOILETS

We love our loos!

 They're hygienic, odour-free and eco-friendly and use no water or nasty chemicals.



• No black water dump.

RUBBISH

- Take all campsite rubbish to Birdsville tip.
- Bins are provided in the Plaza and concert area for pedestrians only.

RECYCLE AT THE BASH

- Collect, separate and recycle your food waste, aluminium cans and PET plastics (2L or smaller).
- Look for marked food waste and recycling bins around Bashville.

CAMPFIRES

- At the request of the local community, please don't collect firewood around camp or between Birdsville and Bashville.
- BYO firewood or buy from the firewood truck (limited quantity).

WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR WASTE WATER

GREYWATER

 The Bash takes place on an organic cattle property. You must catch ALL grey water (eg. dish water) and take it back to town. Dispose of excess in collection tanks at each toilet block (limited capacity).

BLACK WATER

• NO BLACK WATER DISPOSAL ANYWHERE ON SITE (eg. caravan toilet cassettes or 'chamber pots'). Use dump points in Birdsville.



BYO ALCOHOL

Please drink responsibly! Anyone who is intoxicated and causing a nuisance will be removed from the site.



DRONES AND UAVS

Licensed drones and a helicopter operate during the festival. **No other aircraft or drones** are allowed over the festival or surrounding property for safety reasons.



DOGS

Allowed in the Plaza and the dog concert and camping areas. Read the **DOG ATTENDANCE RULES** on website.



FIRE SAFETY

Keep your camp fire-safe. See page 7.



GENERATORS

Allowed between 8am and 8pm.



QUIET CAMP

Please keep noise down **after 10.30pm**. Quiet chat is fine, but no music in camp.



GLASS

No glass in concert, public or camp areas. Glass allowed in your camp kitchen only (eg. oil, mustard, wine indoors).



PROHIBITED

- · Chainsaws/Power tools
- Fireworks
- · Weapons (including firearms & whips)
- · Unregistered vehicles



PEDESTRIAN-FRIENDLY ROADS

- Bashville speed limit 10km/h.
- Limited vehicle movements apply.

ROLL OUT OF BASHVILLE

NEED TO KNOW

More than 60 road marshals.

Over 4000 vehicles leaving Bashville.

As campers pack up they need to join the line. Make room – there's no such thing as pushing in.

AVOID THE CROWDS - EXIT EARLY

Early Exit Thurs 7 @ 2 – 5pm

General Exit Fri 8 from 7am sharp – Sat 9 @ Midday

DRIVING BACK TO BIRDSVILLE

- Expect delays.
- Don't overtake.
- Please observe road closures, changed speed limits and police directions.

ROLL OUT TRAFFIC GUIDE

PRE ROLL OUT 12.30 – 1.30pm

THURSDAY 7TH

Return vehicle from Day Parking: Bring your car back to

your can back to your camp to pack and prepare for roll out.

EARLY EXIT 2pm – 5pm

Early Exit: Pass holders only. Expect some minor delays – passes are capped but there will still be a significant number of vehicles exiting. Passes \$15 online or at Merch tent, available until sold out.

FRIDAY 8TH

PEAK 7am – 2pm

Peak time: Leaving early on Friday you can bet on getting stuck behind other drivers. Wait time up to 2 hours. Please be patient. If you're not in a hurry wait for off-peak time.

SATURDAY 9TH

OFF-PEAK

Off peak: You might experience minor delays, but can generally expect a clean run.
