



- -Train and develop the skills of our volunteers so they can be their best.
- -Have as much fun as we possibly can.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

The committee have endeavoured to make ongoing improvements to our Nipper program across the whole season, here are a few of the positive outcomes:

- Introduced early proficiency days for returning nippers so preseason training could commence.
- Improved communication to nipper families through the introduction of Team App.

- Improved nomination structure for carnivals.
- Improved layout of the Gear Shed as led by Mick Sell.
- Purchased 6 nipper short boards, 2 foamies and one racing mal, plus one second hand racing mal.
- Approved allocation of space in Senior Shed for
- U14 training boards.
- Introduced Twilight Nippers to provide a social environment for nipper families.
- Introduced Coolum Nippers Clean Up to bolster our nippers commitment to our clean coastal environment.
- Increased training opportunities for all nippers across the season.

NEW SEASON OPPORTUNITIES Education and Age Awards

One area that still requires improvement is in education of our age awards, each year nippers are to be provided learning opportunities of many different areas of knowledge and skill. This continues to provide a challenge for Age Managers and more support would be beneficial. This is a great opportunity for next year's committee.

Surfina

We have dabbled over the last two years in introducing surfing opportunities for our nippers. This is a part of our sport and many clubs on the coast include surfing in their Sunday morning program and help to promote the competitive opportunities. A regular surfing opportunity might be something to help retain older nippers but also be helpful to those younger nippers that are still trying to increase their confidence in the water.

Training

This season has bought many positive elements to our training program and identified some weaknesses. As our club grows and our nippers improve in their skill base we need to provide a balance of opportunities for those that wish to develop lifesaving skills and those that want to improve their competitive outcomes.

Another opportunity for next year's committee is to look at how we as a club move forward on paid coaching versus volunteer coaching. All members of our club deserve to be provided the same opportunities.

Nipper Bursary

This year saw the development of a bursary for youth and nippers through our Surf Sports department. This needs to be clearly communicated to our whole club to ensure transparency of what is available and ensure final selection is fair and reasonable for all. This is an opportunity for improvement for next year's committee.

CONCLUSION

Overall Coolum Nippers experienced a great season full of personal bests, confidence builders and some amazing stories of nippers tackling their fears. Thank you to all parents who have provided support throughout the season.

Joint Facility Report



It has been a positive year for the Joint Facility Committee and it is pleasing to report that the key strategic initiatives to take the surf club facility into the future and provide a first class facilities for all members are progressing favorably.

1. Second property - the surf club's off-site property strategy to accommodate the clubs growth and

increasing demands on the club has responded to the suitable real estate opportunities available. The original approach of a surf sports storage and training facility at Quanda Park industrial precinct complimented with a "community co-operative" initiative with either the police precinct or the fire station has now changed. The club has been fortunate to purchase a 1ha free hold property on Yandina Coolum Rd which is in close proximity and has the capability to accommodate all of the club's needs with excellent future development potential.

- 2. Club refurbishment the final major stage of the club improvement/development has been a lengthy process with requirement for approvals to realign the lease boundaries. These approvals are now just waiting for formal notification. It will be exciting times for the club with the opportunity to upgrade the whole of the ground floor club area to include better integration of the various club spaces. The detailed design and layout will be developed through a Building Reference Group of committee members and key stake holders ready for mid-year submissions for council approval. Key improvements for the proposed designs are;
- Dedicated member function/cooking facility
- Wet and dry common room capacity
- Increased lifesaving storage capacity

- Dedicated training room
- New improved surf club entry relocated to the northern side with safer access
- Dedicated access and goods handling area separated from the entry
- Improved building presentation
- 3. Building maintenance the maintenance of the club is the price we pay for "one of the best views on the coast". To keep the club in good repair, the Joint Facility Committee along with the Supporters club team have implemented significant upgrades and improvements over the past year, including;
- Upgrading the fire panels/system to the whole club
- External painting upgrades including subtle changes to the colour scheme
- Upgrades of the admin office layout
- Additional member lockers
- Sponsor/club signage upgrades
- Restaurant acoustic treatments with ongoing installations to improve the dining experience
- Air-conditioning replacement program

It has been a pleasure working with a stable group of members on the Joint Facility Committee including Ian Norman (Surf Club Treasurer), Fred Stokes (Surf Club President and Support Deputy President), Dan Rogers (Surf Club Deputy President), Mal Wright (Supporters Club General Manager) and Stephen Kemp (Life member) who all share a common vision of making our club one of the best on the coast. I am looking forward to the next phase of the development and delivering a members club which will be the envy of all. As always happy to discuss club facilities with all and welcome any and all input.

Financial Health

Ensure that we have the financial capability to meet the clubs needs now and into the future.

Treasurer's Report



After another busy season I am pleased to be able to present the finances for the club for our 2017-2018 season. Overall the club remains in a strong financial position with \$120k in cash reserves and still effectively debt free. The club has retained a small debt of less than \$15k in order to retain the redraw capability of our loan facility should we

need this for building purposes in the near term.

Income for the season was \$1,331k which was up from the previous season due to the move to a formal lease arrangement between Lifesaving and Supporters. Total funds provided by Supporters was \$1,014 compared to \$810k in the previous season. The difference is effectively depreciation which will be set aside for the Lifesaving Sinking Fund. Of note is close to 40% increase in sponsors income to \$106k. Total operating expenditure before depreciation for this season was \$1,100k which was a 8.5% increase on the previous seasons expenditure.

This season the club has focussed it' financial efforts in three key areas ...

- Restructuring the leasing arrangement between Lifesaving and Supporters to ensure that we comply with the Charities Act as well as allowing both Supporters and Lifesaving to operate effectively now and into the future
- Continuing to grow our income level through a strategic focus on sponsors, external grants and effective fundraising programs
- Delivering a range of member benefits through targeted expenditure in the areas of training, Surf Sports and member facilities.

Leasing arrangements - the club has worked with Jeff Sparkes from SLSQ and our auditors (MGI) to set up a restructured lease agreement with Supporters. This arrangement will also see some of the balance sheet assets re-allocated to Supporters and the depreciation split between Lifesaving and Supporters assets. In addition, the sinking fund will be split between Lifesaving and Supporters in line with the asset split. This change will future proof the club in terms of ATO compliance requirements and ensure each entity can operate effectively.

Income growth - this season has seen our sponsor income increase and we welcomed new sponsors in Peregian Springs Golf Club, MGI Audit and Flightcentre Coolum. Our annual collection improved significantly and we also saw great results from the annual Charity Golf day and the 200 Club. Thanks to everyone involved in supporting these programs.

Member benefits - we have continued to work towards providing additional facilities for members growing needs (refer Joint Facility report) as well as funding a range of member benefits including \$57k on supporting our Surf Sports (competition costs and new equipment), \$10k on training and coaching programst, \$9 on a painting refresh for the clubhouse and \$10 on common area upgrades.

We have appointed MGI Audit as our new club auditor. This move will bring a fresh focus on ensuring strong financial governance. Many thanks to SPS Audit and Stephen Shirley for the efforts over the years they were with us.

Looking ahead - as we look towards our 100-year anniversary in 2019 our focus will be on two major equipment purchases with plans underway for the replacement of the Suzuki 4WD used for roving patrols and for a new patrol arena. The club will also be progressing a number of events to celebrate our Centenary season and we will need to allow for these in our budgets for season 2018-2019 and season 2019-2020.


Finally, for next season, we will be incurring additional costs with the servicing of the loan for the Yandina-Coolum Rd property and well as the progression of minor works to enable the facility to address the clubs storage needs.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2018

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General Information

The condensed financial statements cover Coolum Beach Surf Life Saving Club Inc ("the club") as an individual entity. The club is an association incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981.

Basis of Preparation
This financial report is intended to provide users with an update of the latest annual financial statements of the club, and it is recommended that this annual report is read in conjunction with

the full financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2018. The same accounting policies and methods of computation have been followed in this annual report as were applied in the full financial statements.

General Manager's Report



The 17/18 season for Supporters was similar to last season in that it started with two slow months being May and June but we soon picked up momentum throughout the year and have finished very strongly. Financially we are in a very strong position and have set many new turnover records over the Christmas New Year period.

The Bar has performed very well over the past 12 months of trading. We have experienced growth in 11 of the 12 months which we haven't done since the 2013/14 season. This is mainly due to the fact that we changed our beer contract from XXXX to CUB. The new agreement has given us much more flexibility with our beer selection and our members and visitors have supported this move. With very good cost of goods and wages control the bottom line growth was very strong.

The Catering Operation has also experienced 11 months of growth with May 2017 as the only month we didn't beat the previous year's sales. With a higher cost of good result along with more wages due to the increase in sales and general wages growth the bottom line was not as strong as the previous financial year. The cost of goods is a constant battle with the price of food forever increasing along with the fact that we prepare the majority of the menu from scratch here at the club as opposed to buying in pre-made items. This does, however, provide a better quality product to our members and visitors so it's not all bad but when looked at from a financial standpoint it doesn't look as good as previous seasons. The Supporters Club Committee made a strategic decision back in 2012 to take back the operations of our restaurant and in recent years we have moved towards having a premium club offer in our restaurant and with our new kitchen along with continuous improvement of our service and food offerings I believe that we continue to achieve this goal.

Our Gaming room had a good year in relation to turnover however due to more payouts and jackpot paid to customers this has resulted in a similar bottom line result as to the previous year.

Poker Machines are subject to much debate and conjecture within politics and the community in general as to whether or not they have a place within community Clubs throughout Queensland. You may have seen recently with relation to the future of Peregian Surf Club that some members of the local community do not believe that pokies should form part of a community club. We aren't solely reliant on Pokies here at Coolum Surf Club however they do make up around 40% of the Clubs Operating Profit. So without them volunteers of the Surf Life Saving Club would be relied upon much more heavily for

fundraising activities as well as door knocking appeals to collect donations from the community which was how Surf Clubs survived before Pokies came along.

Pokies were introduced to Clubs in Queensland back in 1992 and since then have helped the Not-For-Profit Community Club industry become sustainable in the ever-changing economy that we find ourselves within. Community clubs are an integral part of the Queensland economy. Each year clubs in Queensland generate around \$2.2 billion in revenue and pay \$513 million in taxes, of which around 49% is associated with gaming operations, and a further 43% in GST – around \$220 million. Across Queensland, the value of Clubs social contribution is estimated to be worth around \$853 million per annum. You can be certain that Pubs and Casinos do not contribute to the community to this level as their goal is to make bigger profits for their owners and shareholders as opposed to supporting Surf Life Saving and the Community to which Coolum Beach SLS Supporters Club does very well year after year.

The staff of Coolum Surf Club have performed admirably once again and served our members and visitors at a very high level throughout the year. My sincere thanks goes to all of our hard working staff members.

Thank you to the Supporters President John Ellingsen and the rest of the Supporters committee for their efforts and ongoing support. A big thank you also goes to my Department Management team consisting of Sharon Sutton, Kirstin Martin, and Brad Fechner, they work hard and are very committed to the Club.

Club Profile

Our History

1918 A legend begins

Jack Morgan agrees to "do something about lifesaving at the beach" at Coolum as a Maroochy council lifeauard for 8 shillings a day from 6:00am to 6:00pm.

1919 The reel deal

Royal Lifesavers from Brisbane present Coolum locals with the first surf reel on Easter, paving the way for volunteer patrols and thousands of lives saved.

1923 On its feet

After some though times, including the reported drowning of club member, Frank Reed, who hit his head on rocks, the Coolum Beach Surf Lifesaving Club reportedly forms as a constituted club with new extensions to its rescue shed.

1936 Made to order

Coolum's first purpose - built clubhouse, costing £300, is officially opened in a gala ceremony by state transport minister J. Dash, and would serve the lifesavers until 1962. The old building was then used as the first Coolum Bowls Clubhouse.

1948 Black Boxing Day

Coolum Surf Club's worst day in history sees war hero/ lifesaver, Dick Lugge, 26; drown while trying to help rescue three people in massive seas. Nurse, June Caldwell is saved, but her father and a friend also perish. A second beltman, Bob Ross, is saved by club legend, Ernie berg, on a ski.

1949 Never walk away

The Club is reduced to just two active members but club stalwarts, Keith Peterie and Ron Want, decide to stay on and train up local teenagers to patrol. This was a pivotal moment - the club could have folded never to reform. An influx of Brisbane student teachers as clubbies in the 1950's helps rescue the club.

1952 Carnival time

After a long break, mainly due to the dark days of war, Coolum hosts its first surf carnival since 1937, attracting a massive crowd of 3,000 and the clubs of Bribie, Kirra, Met Caloundra, Maroochydore, Alexandra Headland, Noosa and host Coolum. Legendary surf belt swimmer Steve Wilkes, of Alex was the star of the day winning the surf swim and the belt races.

1966 The new guard

Coolum lifesaver, Don Kennedy follows in Jack Morgan's footsteps after being appointed one of the first modern lifeguards. The Kennedy family was one of a number of prominent families to make major contributions to the Coolum Surf Club. Angie Kennedy, daughter of life member Bob, was an elite national swimmer who took silver at the Atlanta Olympics.

1977 Duck power arrives

Coolum joins the IRB rescue revolution with the first purchase of a rubber duck and 25hp motor that would consign the surf reel to history. IRB's replaced the club's illfated experimental minijet boat, and are now often the frontline rescue craft along with the tube and rescue board.

1980 The female wave

Shaun Kennedy, the daughter of club stalwart, Don Kennedy, helps break tradition and is the first of many Coolum females to pass her Bronze at Coolum. Women clubbies soon made their mark with the support of their male counterparts, and today are involved in almost every facet of lifesaving, including instructing, driving IRB's and serving as Patrol Captains.

1985 Saving the day

Coolum SLSC rescue helicopter volunteers, Greg Lennox and Glen Garrick, win bravery awards for saving the crew of the yacht "Magic Dragon" at Flinders Reef, in cyclonic seas and high winds at night - it does not get any harder than that.

1991 Simply the best

Awesome Under 18 double ski team of Michael Daly and David Prior, breakthrough for the club's first ever Australian Lifesaving championship in Perth, on a wet, and miserable day that was pure gold for Coolum. The mighty pair finished the season undefeated.

2013 Historical moment

The clubs first history book "Breathing Life into Coolum Beach - The Chronicles of the Coolum Beach Surf Life Saving Club" is launched by editor, Patrol Captain and now Life Member Peter Gardiner. The book is the result of a five-year labour of love.
