Hello club members,

Well I have been in what seems like never ending meetings and emails these past few months. If not with Transport NSW via various sub-groups I am involved with, then with members of committees and Boards. It is wonderful to meet up and talk with your CMC Committee as we all work together and get things done promptly and hassle free. However, such things as the National body, AHMF, and the presidential issues are an example of ructions we can do without please.

A continuous stream of photos showing me highly modified vehicles with H and J plates hanging off the bumper bars is another irksome thing. I am happy for folks to send them in, so keep them up please. We do want to sort them out and clean up the system. Just a worry that they keep happening.

I do have to remember what went on back in the day. One example was a 1978 Torana A9X lookalike which may well seem highly modified to a passer-by. However, GM-H made all those things available back in the 70's, so they could win Bathurst races. Huge bonnet scoops, mud-guard flares, 10-inch-wide wheels etc.

Period Options and Accessories are permitted and as we get on into the newer range of 30 year old vehicles we have to remember that fact. Some American parts and options catalogues from the muscle car era such as FoMoCo, Mopar and the like are very thick indeed. BMW and Mercedes Benz had a lot of options as well. There is no mention of MODIFICATIONS in the HVS rules, so those who transpose Period Modifications for Period Options and Accessories have got it wrong. Invariably I find that the Primary club listed on the website for the given number plate is not a member of any group within ACMC, so we have no option but to put them in to Transport NSW.

There are still around 400 clubs on the 1,000 plus list of HVS accepted clubs which are not linked to any group organization. If not, then they cannot get CVS, so that is why they hand out HVS. We have to continue to tidy up these cars as abuse of the system will not help our cause in keeping it going for you, our membership.

And speaking of Period Options and Accessories, expect to see that controversial draft list which has been up on the Transport NSW website, to disappear soon. It will be replaced with a better document with words that will give the clubs more decision making ability on what should and should not be on their members vehicles.

We have always contended that no specific list can fit all vehicle types and models. Accessories on one brand would never be available on others. Look at 1952 when all you could get was a cigarette lighter and a venetian blind for the back window. That is a lot different to 1992 with the myriad of options available.

We will be asking for a clause to cover vehicles that were altered in their early life. Such things as Ambulances, tow trucks and stretch limos should stay that way as a part of motoring history.

One loss we have had is the ask to have the GVM limit on CVS lifted from 3,500 kg to 4,500 kg which is the limit for ordinary licence holders. Transport NSW say that there are only a few types of light trucks and buses affected, so until there is a re-write of the CVS rules, it will not be considered as a priority.

If you want to register a truck or bus which is over 3,500 GVM then it has to be as it was in its early life. That way you can be given HVS as there is no weight limit on the early system. The limit came from RMS at the start of CVS as a precaution to avoid what happens in other states. People get a 1990s truck chassis, fit new everything like engine, auto box, power steer and then include a Winnebago body and away we go on our grey nomad trips. Not exactly what the intent of club rego is shall we say. It is there to help club members preserve our motoring history and keep it on the roads. Not there to help people avoid the cost of full rego. on their whiz bang mobile home.

As mentioned to delegates at the late March meeting we are close to getting those long awaited new, smaller number plates for CVS. A few other changes will happen as well. Main point is that your existing plates will stay the same UNLESS you want to change to the new ones. They will just be phased in as old stock depletes.

They look like they will be OK to fit into those recesses in the bumper bars of American cars and will not affect the frontal air inlet of many cars as much as the current ones. Keep an eye out, but do not expect much until after testing is completed in late April. **PLEASE do not go to Service NSW and ask for the new ones just yet.** When it happens we will let you know and if you wish, you will be able to go down and swap the previous big ones for these new items. They will have "NSW Classic Vehicle" on them so they will not look like a golf cart or fork lift truck.

Another recent issue is the practice we have had for many, many years that on 1st January each year, vehicles from 30 years back become eligible for club rego. No matter what month it might say on the VIN or chassis plate, it can start HVS or CVS that year. 2022 equals all 1992 vehicles. That comes from the days when chassis numbers barely told you the year the car was made. Even then you had to know what to look for to sort it out. The 8,9,0,1,2 &3 at the front of a 48-215 Holden chassis plate or tag welded to the rail tells you the year it was made. Nothing more than that available to date the car. VIN numbers and exact build dates are a relatively recent innovation. For 1992 cars you can almost pinpoint the hour it came off the production line.

The powers that be in Transport NSW are of the opinion that the vehicle HAS to be 30 years old, not 29 years and a few months. That is what the intent of the regulation is they say. Luckily, we can find the old versions of the rules so we can show them what it was. If it does change we will ask for it to be at the start of 2023 so current vehicles are not affected.

So let's get out there now that things are freer and join in the fun. The extensive list of places you can go on National Motoring Heritage Day (15th May) is a great way to start off.

This is the report that I have been wanting to write for more than a year, bringing some good news to all our supporters and to the clubs our Foundation is itself designed to support.

The times have been tough but we have put the past two years to good use. We have been busy consolidating our collections, our volunteer force and our relationships. The volunteers and initial donors are mainly from the clubs and they're magnificent. Our refurbished home building is fit for purpose, education and research is our specialty, the 'hub for clubs' is our focus.

The Foundation is now formally recognised as a Strategic Partner of the ARDC alongside the NSW State Government, Destinations NSW, the Blacktown City Council and the Western Sydney Parklands Trust. So we are one of five independent bodies all working with the ARDC in achieving optimum results for people who use Sydney Motorsport Park. That is great for you.

Clearly we have begun a new phase of growth, as an independent participant in the big new precinct for motoring innovation being built up by the ARDC at Sydney Motorsport Park. Our resources and our structure are sorted, in line with the objectives our founders first put several years ago to the ARDC, and the many clubs in the CMC. We salute Terry Thompson OAM, one of our six first 'visionaries' and now honoured Ambassador.

Our major project for the first quarter of 2022 is the installation of our custom-built relational database. It will be unique among motor heritage research tools in Australia. This is a big undertaking which will take our Foundation truly onto the national and international platform for world-wide access and sharing of resources expertise and research.

We will use it on all the heritage subjects and projects that interest our supporters. The owners and restorers of our cars will specially value it as the ICE cars are gradually superseded. Our education focus is a main part of the mission, we will be starting at the primary school level, we are looking for government support now that we can get out and about.



This cloud-based database is expensive to set up and to maintain, we have major initial donations but we will need funds and enthusiastic volunteers to use it well. Calling all clubs!

Our second project now under way, is an authoritative study of the economic impact of the motor heritage movement or 'industry' in Australia. The first stage, a desktop study of applicable literature was handled with substantial support from our partner the Western Sydney University and was finalised in December.

Now we are taking that to the next stage, seeking a partner and funding for the research and writing of the study itself. When finished late in 2022, this study will mark out the importance of the motor heritage movement in the economic and social landscape of Australia.

This 'big picture' work is for the clubs, and its secondary aim is at the governments of Australia at all levels. We expect that clubs, and most companies that service our historic and heritage movement—insurers, dealers, importers, venue owns, events managers—will use it as a tool to plan the pathways to a viable future for their business.

One final point. At last supporting enthusiasts and clubs can visit the Motor Heritage base now to see the way we have pulled it together during the two years of Covid constraints. Starters include the Mercedes-Benz Club, the Thoroughbred Sports Car Club, the HSRCA and ARDC, and the Rolls-Royce Owners. They have an overview of our volunteers' work and to see how we are managing our resources. Talk to us to arrange a club visit.

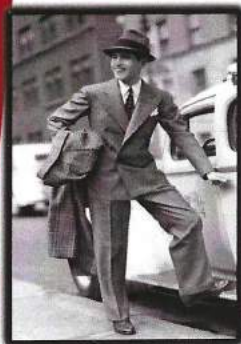

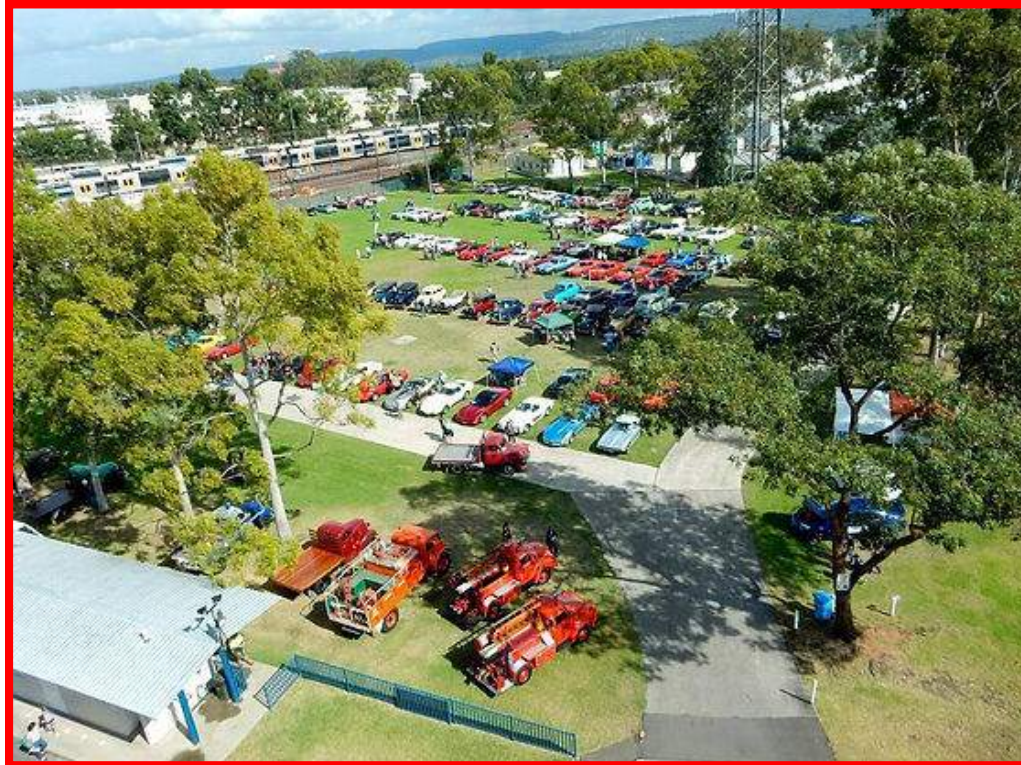

Learner driver RBT program passes major milestone

More than 2000 learner drivers have attended a course that guides them through RBT stops – and gives them an opportunity to approach police about the rules of the road.



An Australian-first learner driver program that guides novice motorists through random breath test stops, gives them an opportunity to approach police about road-rule questions – and explains the importance of giving way to emergency vehicles – has passed a major milestone.

Established five years ago, the learner driver program run on Sydney's Eastern Creek Raceway was attended by its 2000th student last night.

The free once-a-month courses – booked out months in advance – are designed to give learners an opportunity to get familiar with their car at safe, road-legal speeds and away from other traffic and impatient road users. The Australian Racing Drivers Club donates free access to the racing circuit once a month, under strict supervision and away from tailgating drivers.

A year ago, the program began being supported by the NSW Police Traffic and Highway Patrol, which each month sets up a pretend random breath-testing site in pit lane, to show learner drivers the safe way to approach an RBT stop.

Police also explain to learner drivers when it's safe and legal to reach for their phone, to show their identification once stopped by police. The learner drivers are also able to ask police about any road rule questions they may have. "This is about giving learner drivers an opportunity to drive at safe speeds on a roadway where there is no other traffic and then we also guide them through what to do if they are stopped at an RBT site." Said Acting Sergeant Steve Planinic from the NSW Traffic and Highway Patrol.



"We also have other emergency services vehicles here from time to time, to give learners an opportunity to know what it's like to have an emergency vehicle go past them under lights and sirens, and how they should move safely out of the way."

"That means when an emergency vehicle approaches and goes past them on the road, it hopefully won't be such a shock, and they will know what to do."

Police also do speed checks on the evenings – held on the first Tuesday of each month from 6pm to 8pm – even though it's a racetrack. At the start of the night, learners are advised not to exceed 90km/h – the same limit as the road for novice drivers – and warned to take it easy in corners, or risk being sent home.



Although the program is held on a racetrack, it is focused on learners becoming more familiar with their car at slow speeds, rather than taking racing lines.

"Accidents, severe injury and death on our roads in the under-25 age bracket has always been disproportionately high," said Glenn Matthews, CEO of the Australian Racing Drivers' Club (ARDC).

With the help of police – and Driving Solutions, an advanced driver training firm that teaches all skill levels from learners to racers – the learner driver program aims to give novices a better chance of making it home safely.

We believe proper driver-training and education is a big step forward in the education of any young learner," said Mr. Matthews.

Importantly, there is no deference to socio-economic backgrounds, as these are free events. It is available to all, including families who may not be able to afford driving schools and training courses."

The ARDC donates the circuit time, Driving Solutions donates its training experts and NSW Police are there to answer about road safety.

Now in its fifth year, the learner driver evenings are set to continue for the foreseeable future.

The program has been so successful, road safety advocates are trying to expand the program across other parts of NSW and the rest of the country – where there may be a suitable venues available.

"When I grew up, as a learner there was always a lot of empty car parks or quiet streets where you could practice on weekends with no-one else around," said James Stewart of Driving Solutions.

"But we don't have those spaces any more, and it's getting harder for learner drivers to take that first step onto the road before they get enough skills and enough confidence to start blending in with other traffic.

"Hopefully learner driver programs like this will start to roll out in other parts of Australia that can provide the same support."

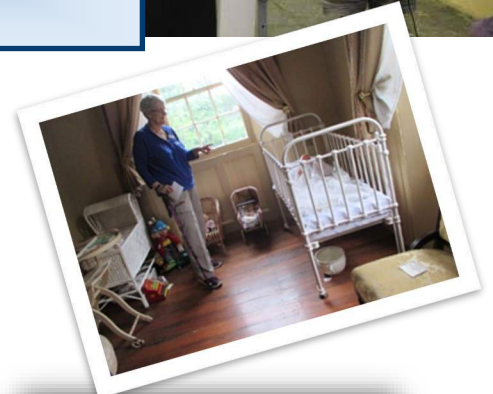

Ever wondered where the iconic Aussie rotary mower Victa originated? Not by Mervyn Victor Richardson as you all thought. Mervyn Victor Richardson took "borrowing your neighbours lawn mower" to a whole new level when he laid eyes on the petrol-driven rotary mower designed by neighbour Lawrence Hall, a Marine Engineer, in November 1948. Hall invented it so he could easily mow his mother's lawn & the grounds of the Cabarita Speedboat Club. Richardson was so impressed he gained permission to "borrow" the idea and went on to build & develop the Victa Mower, the Aussie icon which turned "grass into lawn" in 1952. Also on exhibit is a scale model of the Mortlake Ferry, also Arnott's & Bushell's displays as they were companies in this area & a brass fireman's helmet made by Rider & Bell, a local company, manufactured from 1947 to 1965.  - ✓ *Release of a model variation which had a major impact on Australian motoring events or history (Ford Falcon GT or Mini Cooper S would fall under this category).*

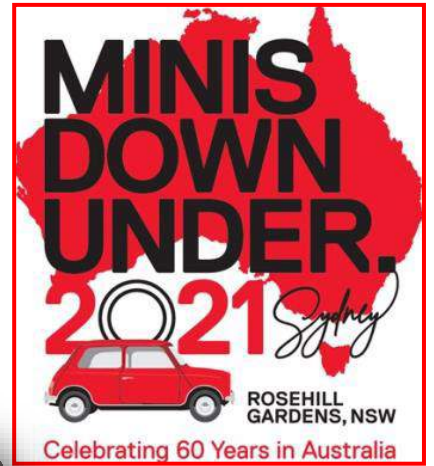
